**Abstract of Incident**

A teenage resident who had just returned from a scheduled court appearance was being processed back into the facility. During the processing said resident mentioned to the detention officer (dc) that he was not feeling well. When asked what was the problem, said resident stated he felt like he was beginning to have difficulty breathing. At that point, dc stopped the processing procedure and said resident was escorted to his room so he could lie down and relax.

According to the dc, said resident's breathing continued to become more labored. The dc radioed for assistance from the shift supervisor (ss). Upon arrival the ss, immediately requested that the OxySure System be brought to the resident's location. When the system arrived, it was initiated as instructed and within a minute or so said resident's breathing began to show marked improvement towards normal. Resident continued on the oxygen for approx. 14 minutes. During this time he was given a medication for asthma and was back with the other residents for the remainder of the program.

The incident was the first where the OxySure System was utilized. The staff stated it was user friendly and definitely helped get the situation under control much faster.
